Morning tea voucher are we going to give the Bus people a voucher as they exit the bus, also what are we going to charge for entry & m/tea. Did it all work out as planned & do we need to look at other ideas. (also, comments made by kitchen staff that some members were in & out all day getting food & drink, do we need to put limits)

- Is it worth looking to borrow / hire till/s from EDOS for sales area? Was there any feedback as to how the sales area coped using the eftpos machine? (one prob was that because Bendigo had system probs the next week we had probs getting final balances. also, the machine is supposed to print a reconciliation overnight which did not happen on Saturday night or Sunday, also Llew was not aware that eftpos Receipts were to be returned to bank for Rec.
- Mistake was made in editing plant sales data, should have started a new day for Sat & Sun instead of running it all into one. By doing this we will be able to reconcile sales daily.
- Food supplies: Considering one person pulling out at the last minute it has now been put forward that the ladies running the kitchen get together the meeting before the show & discuss what is needed ETC.
- Westpac Bank Beaudesert: As of mid-May, the branch will be closing so a motion was put to the committee by Peter Rice & seconded by Garth Dale that we transfer our Monies over to the Bendigo in Canungra on or before that time.
- Frame for stage: it was put to the committee that we look at getting prices for the building of a more user-friendly frame.

Floats for Show: It was felt that the kitchen float was a little high & that the Plant Sales needed more Smaller denominations (coins & notes) & maybe not as much.

Cut Above: will contact Norma Ensor re giving a talk this year. (Have made a booking for September 18<sup>th</sup>)


Freedom Internet: will invite Steven Taylor to attend next committee meeting & show everyone how to edit the web site.
